11th Indonesian Students' International Conference

"Navigating global uncertainty with clarity and purpose: Moving toward a better future"

Konferensi Internasional Pelajar Indonesia ke-11(11th KIPi) will be held in Sydney, Australia on 13-14 July 2026. We are calling on all Indonesian students and researchers to submit their abstracts and be invited to present them at a conference in Sydney, Australia.

The conference will examine the challenges faced by the international community amid growing global uncertainty, particularly due to ongoing physical conflicts and escalating tariff wars. Geopolitical tensions and protectionist trade policies have increasingly disrupted global stability, international cooperation, and economic systems. Through multidisciplinary discussions, the conference aims to explore how these dynamics shape international relations, global trade, and economic resilience, and to identify potential strategies for navigating an increasingly complex and fragmented world.

There are two submission categories, which are the research paper and the policy brief paper.

Research Paper Category

The Research Paper category invites submissions that present original research, conceptual frameworks, or rigorous empirical analyses related to the conference theme. The conference also invites presentations from students at all levels (Bachelors, Masters, and PhD) who wish to share their work, including **work-in-progress**, in a supportive environment. Submissions can include completed research or work-in-progress and should demonstrate clear research questions, appropriate methodology, and theoretical or empirical contributions to scholarly debates. The event aims to foster academic exchange across campuses and encourage meaningful conversations among students, staff, peers, and the broader academic community.

Policy Brief Paper Category

The Policy Brief Paper category invites submissions that provide concise, analytical, and evidence-based discussions aligned with the conference theme. Policy briefs should go beyond academic contribution by offering clear problem definitions, actionable policy recommendations, and practical insights relevant for policymakers, practitioners, civil society organizations, and international institutions. This category is particularly suitable for participants at all levels (Bachelors, Masters, and PhD) who wish to translate research findings or applied analysis into policy-oriented outputs that contribute to strategic decision-making.

Conference Thematic Tracks

The main theme of the 11th KIPi is "Navigating global uncertainty with clarity and purpose: Moving toward a better future". As the breakdown of that theme, we have 6 thematic tracks as follows:

- 1. Economic transformation, business managerial and entrepreneurial;**
This subtheme focuses on discussions related to global and national economic transformation, business and managerial innovation, entrepreneurship development, the digital economy, financial inclusion, adaptive economic policies, and strategies to respond to economic disruptions in an increasingly uncertain global environment.
- 2. Language, education, art, design, pop-culture, and media;**
This subtheme explores the role of language, education, arts, design, popular culture, and media in shaping creative and adaptive societies. Topics may include educational innovation, media literacy, cultural diplomacy, intercultural communication, and the role of arts and media in responding to global challenges.

3. Health, (bio)medicine, and wellbeing;

This subtheme covers issues related to public health, biomedical research, medical innovation, mental health, healthcare systems, and interdisciplinary approaches aimed at improving human wellbeing in the context of evolving global health challenges.

4. International relation, politics, law, security, anti-corruption, and sociology;

This subtheme focuses on the dynamics of international relations, governance, law, global security, anti-corruption efforts, and sociological perspectives related to stability, justice, and sustainable societal development.

5. Climate resilience, sustainability, agriculture, environment, and energy;

This subtheme addresses climate resilience, environmental sustainability, agricultural innovation, natural resource management, energy transition, and strategies to maintain ecological balance while supporting sustainable development.

6. Engineering, emerging technology, and digital innovation.

This subtheme includes discussions on engineering advancements, artificial intelligence, digital transformation, emerging technologies, and technological innovations that support sustainable development and improve the quality of life.

Guideline

All abstracts should be submitted through the electronic submission system and will be reviewed by an abstract review panel. Please read the following guidelines carefully before submitting your abstract:

- Abstracts can only be submitted through the online portal <https://www.ppi-australia.org/en/kipi-2026>
- Abstracts must be written in English
- Limit text to between 800 – 1500 words for a research paper or 250 – 500 words for a policy brief paper
- Follow the format of the abstract from the provided template
- Use single line spacing
- Avoid the use of abbreviations within the text
- Title should not exceed 150 characters
- List the authors and affiliations
- Word (.doc) files are acceptable
- Max file size is 10MB (try to compress figures if needed)
- Follow the format of short biodata from the provided template
- For the extended abstract, you are not required to include citations & references. However, if you are accepted, please include citations in your presentations.
- For work-in-progress research, reporting research findings is not required. The emphasis should be placed on the current stage of progress.
- **AI Declaration:** Authors must disclose the use of any artificial intelligence (AI) tools (e.g., generative AI for writing, editing, data analysis, or image generation) in the registration form. AI tools should only be used to assist with language editing or formatting and must not replace the authors' responsibility for the originality, accuracy, and integrity of the work. The authors remain fully responsible for the content of the submission.

Please check the option “I agree to include this extended abstract to be published in the Conference Proceedings.” If you want your abstract to be published in our conference proceedings, please check the option; otherwise, your abstract will not be published.

Please note that your extended abstract should be more than 800 words and not exceed the 1500-word limit. Ensure that your abstract is clear and coherent. The title is in a 14-point boldface Arial font. It should be in lower case with the first letter of major words in upper case. The names of each author should be in a 10-point boldface Arial font. The authors' affiliations are also in 10-point Arial font, and should include the institution's name, city and country. The main text of the extended abstract is in Times New Roman, 12-point font. All paragraphs are text-justified. The first line of each paragraph is indented by 0.5cm. There is no blank line between paragraphs.

We have no strict guidelines on the layout of the abstract, but you may follow the example structures of the following:

1. INTRODUCTION

State a description of the problem background being analysed, and the purpose and objective of the research.

2. METHODS

Describe the study's basic design, including key techniques used. Include information on the study period, setting, location, and population.

3. RESULTS (CAN BE EXCLUDED FOR WORK IN PROGRESS RESEARCH)

Report the key findings that address the purpose of the study. Highlight any finding in the data.

4. CONCLUSIONS (CAN BE EXCLUDED FOR WORK IN PROGRESS RESEARCH)

Summarise the overall findings and explain the significance and future implications of the results.

You may include tables or figures (graphics or images) (maximum 3 in total) in the text; do not forget to include citations or sources of the figures.

The title is in a 14-point boldface Arial font. It should be in lower case with the first letter of major words in upper case. The names of each author should be in a 10-point boldface Arial font. The authors' affiliations are also in 10-point Arial font, and should include the institution's name, city and country. The main text of the extended abstract is in Times New Roman, 12-point font. All paragraphs are text-justified. The first line of each paragraph is indented by 0.5cm. There is no blank line between paragraphs.

We have no strict guidelines on the layout of the abstract, but you must provide a brief description of the problem, its urgency, the research methods used, the research results, and the policy implications. This summary typically features three or four key points, focusing on the main takeaways that policymakers should understand, even if they read no further in the document.

You may include tables or figures (graphics or images) (maximum 3 in total) in the text; do not forget to include citations or sources of the figures.
